Devotion Guidelines for www.JobToJoy.us

Job To Joy focuses on a positive, encouraging tone for people in a job or career transition.

Basic Mechanics

- 1. Name your devotion and include your name, such as: "Devotion" by Your Name.
- 2. In the subject line of your submission e-mail, put: JobToJoy Devotion "Title".
- 3. Devotions should be about 250-450 words long, with an appropriate title.
- 4. Put your contact information in the header or e-mail for each devotion you submit (see example above), Include your: name, mailing address, e-mail address, and 10-digit phone number. This is only in case we have a question and is not posted with your devotion.
- 5. Electronic submissions only; as an attachment, or in the body of your e-mail message.
- 6. Devotion format includes: a title, quoted scripture verse, personal witness or reflection on scripture. It may also include: a "thought for the day" (a pithy, summarizing statement), and end with a "prayer focus" or "challenge to action" or a relevant quotation.
- 7. Avoid preaching (such as "you should ..." or "we must ...").
- 8. Give references for scripture passages, including the Bible version (as Ps. 119:11 AMP).
- 9. Give the original source of materials you quote.
- 10. Put your author's/speaker's BIO in the footer, or after the devotion (see example below).
- 11. Attach a photo of yourself to your e-mail; JPG file types are preferred, small files please.

Devotion Writing Tips

- 1. The www.JobToJoy.us ministry welcomes beginning and advanced writers.
- 2. Begin with studying and meditating on the Bible so its power supports your words.
- 3. Connect scripture with your own life. Your experience is unique. Good devotional writing is authentic. It connects real events of daily life with the truth of God.
- 4. Make only one point. Think snapshot, not movie. Perhaps you have 3 devotions, not 1.
- 5. Describe a situation that you link to a Bible passage, using a specific life event.
- 6. Share your struggles and how faith or Bible truth helped or was proven true to you.
- 7. Use language and examples that appeal to the five senses. Tell what you heard, saw, touched, smelled, tasted. If appropriate, use dialogue to tell your story.
- 8. Focus on nurturing the Christian commitment, spiritual growth, or encouraging readers.
- 9. Seek always to encourage readers to deeper engagement with the Bible or living in faith.
- 10. Review your devotion. Decide which details best convey your message, delete the rest.
